Requests for assistance must be submitted to the Elder of the Mission Team.

Compton Fund. This fund supports year round needs for school supplies at Compton Elementary. The funds are utilized to target “at risk” children who might not otherwise have access to needed school supplies.

MUST Summer Lunch Fund. This fund supports Macland’s participation in the MUST Ministries Summer Lunch Program. Each summer Macland volunteers make 500 lunches for Cobb County children in need. Funds are used to purchase needed food items for the lunches.
